A) My name is Dr. DS and I am interested in the radiologist opportunity at Lake Cumberland Regional Hospital. I commend you and all those involved for your extremely informative and comprehensive website which provided the online job tour. My wife and I are particularly excited about the possibility of returning to a smaller, more cohesive area in the Midwest, as is Somerset. We have fond memories of the Midwest, having previously lived in both Indiana and Missouri. Somerset reminds us of the small town where I did my medicine internship, called Cooperstown, NY (population about 2500). The hospital was down the street from a beautiful lake (Lake Otsego) and was surrounded by picturesque mountains.

My wife and I loved the **sense of community** in both the town and the hospital including the collegial atmosphere that was fostered by all staff at the hospital. Somerset and Lake Cumberland Regional Hospital seem to be quite similar, down to the mere fact that it is surrounded by a beautiful lake! What draws us to Somerset and your facility is the **readily apparent** collegial atmosphere, the stability of the hospital, the devotion to providing outstanding clinical care including recent expansion projects and new state-of-the art equipment, and the **safe, tranquil** surroundings with outstanding schools. While we do not yet have children, it is certainly in our plans, and education of children is of paramount importance to us.
